


2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Substance Use Disorders

- Continued implementing SUD prevention programs in Pierce County schools, including tobacco cessation classes in Ellsworth and prevention presentations on vape and fentanyl
- Ellsworth Middle School hosted Hazelden's "Top Secret Project" for parents and interested community members in May 2022
- Completed a partner review of the WI Addiction Recovery Help Line database through 211 SCV to ensure the accuracy and inclusion of all appropriate resources
- Pierce and St. Croix Counties analyzed the results of the 2021 Youth Risk Behavior Survey and presented the results to school staff to help agencies understand trends in mental health and substance use behaviors in high school students

Mental Health

- Trained two new Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) facilitators to serve St. Croix and Pierce Counties
- Trained 200 individuals in Youth and Adult Mental Health First Aid through collaboration with United Way St. Croix Valley and YMCA in Hudson
- Provided Make It Okay mental health stigma reduction training to more than 100 faith formation students
- Allina Health continues to provide Change to Chill to school partners, reaching more than 2,000 students
- Ellsworth School provided YMHFA training for 16 additional staff members
- Ellsworth school district hosted an "Anxiety in Children and Youth" panel presentation for parents and community members
- Seven school districts were trained on Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) in Schools curriculum
- Western Wisconsin Health co-led DBT-inspired mental wellness classes for 22 students in two school districts
- The healthcare systems continued to add new psychiatry and mental health therapy providers and telehealth options to meet the mental health needs of the community
- Western Wisconsin Health provided care coordination for 48 positive food insecurity questionnaire results in the clinic and inpatient unit to provide food bags and resources
- Pierce County Public Health was awarded a \$30,000 grant to provide arts-based focus groups to key populations impacted by the pandemic. The focus groups will focus on artistic expression as a form of mental health recovery. The focus groups will be implemented in 2023.
- River Valley Trails sponsored the creation of Limitless Cycling, an adaptive bicycle program offering three different adaptive bikes and services to area senior centers, assisted living centers, nursing homes, and other groups
- In partnership with other HT members, United Way was awarded a \$100,000 grant from WI DHS to focus on building partnerships around housing issues in Pierce and St. Croix Counties. The grant supported the development of a data dashboard and key informant interviews to better understand housing issues and opportunities in our communities. A final report with recommendations will be developed in 2023.



Mental Health continued

- Explored additional policy and system changes that increase access to nutritious food and reduce the stigma often associated with utilizing food pantries and similar resources
- Conducted a survey with food pantry partners to identify additional opportunities to reduce stigma and increase access to food
- Continued identification of food deserts in Pierce and St. Croix County and created an at-a-glance map to help hunger relief partners identify additional opportunities for programming
- The St. Croix Valley Foodbank distributed just over 4.2 million pounds of food to over 212,000 individuals.
- Translated materials into Spanish for the backpack program at local libraries
- River Valley Trails provided bicycle safety events for elementary-age youth to encourage safe and active outdoor biking practices
